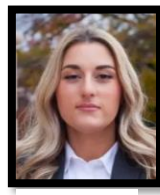

SB 998 Forcing Ratepayers to PAY/Take Risk for Corporate Utility Projects

Horroric Bill was introduced on February 3, 2025, by Republican Senator Grant Green, Senator Todd Gollihare and Rep Trey Caldwell, and was passed into law May 14th 2025.

SB 998 Allows public utilities to charge Oklahomans for the construction of new power plants (and data centers??) before they're even operational. Previously, utilities could not recover construction costs until the facilities were complete and a formal rate case was approved by regulators. This bill changes that PROTECTION, **letting massive utility companies shift their financial risk directly onto ratepayers.** A Commissioner has warned this law will cause “rate shock” for consumers, shorten oversight timelines, and strip the Oklahoma Corporation Commission of part of its constitutional authority to keep rates fair and reasonable.

SB1126

Government Run School Budget

Authored by Hall & T Caldwell Became Law without Governor's signature 5/29/25.

Allocates approx. \$3.98 billion funding to the State Department of Education from the General Appropriations bill for FY 2025-26.

Education is not the role of government—it is the responsibility of a child's parents or family. Schools can and should be privatized, without any need for public funding that steals from taxpayers (e.g., property taxes) and drains the treasury.

The best “school choice,” by far, is for parents to choose not to place their child's education in the hands of the state. Educational and economic freedom cannot be achieved by forcing other citizens to give up their hard-earned tax dollars for a failing and government-run school system.

HR 1001 Refusing to Allow Our Representatives to Have Their Bills Heard.

(House Rules Only) Authored by Gann, & R West.

Introduced and Tabled 2/3/25.

Oklahoma House members voted to table this, one of the most important proposals of the year, known as The Gann Plan. It would guarantee every legislator the right to vote on at least two of their bills each session. By tabling the measure, the powerful House Speaker (Kyle Hilbert) and his hand-picked chairmen retained the ability to discriminate against representatives by refusing to grant hearings for their bills. Until elected state representatives are guaranteed the right to request a hearing and a vote on their proposals, the system of democratic, republican representation remains deeply inhibited.

SJR 34 Judicial Checks & Balances – House Rejects

A Constitutional Amendment - *if approved by voters, would amend the Oklahoma Constitution by granting the Governor the power to nominate and appoint all judicial officers with the advice and consent of the Senate (just as US Judges)*, instead of allowing a commission of members, six of whom are publicly unelected members of the Oklahoma Bar Association make the decision. This is a conflict of interest, when lawyers can become Judges. This stops the ability to circumvent representative government and returns us to a system of checks and balances, where those appointed to a non-elected public office are nominated or confirmed by at least one of the elected bodies of government. **This bill passed in the Senate but Failed in the House.**
